## CORPORATE SERVICES INFORMATION REPORT - FINANCIAL SERVICES 2017-17

2016 Capital Carry-overs

ORIGIN:

Director, Financial Services/Treasurer

In accordance with the Procedure By-law, any Member of Council may make a request to the Town Clerk that this Information Report be placed on an upcoming Committee of the Whole agenda for discussion.

### **COMMENTS**

The 2016 capital expenditures budget totaled \$65,510,824. The actual expenditures were \$18,451,097; including \$2,279,719 for Station 4-5 land acquisition, \$1,486,486 for fire vehicle and equipment replacement, \$1,328,822 for Old Town Hall Restoration, and \$8,157,967 for road projects. A balance of \$29,967,952 is to be carried over into 2017, while \$11,737,685 is to be carried over into 2018. A net amount of \$5,354,450 is not being carried over due to cancelled projects and project savings.

Carry-overs are the transfer of the unspent portion of capital budgets, to the following year. As such, the expenditures and financing already have Council approval. The budget amounts carried over are combined with the "new" budget amounts and are reported on the financial statements.

Capital projects may be incomplete for a number of reasons, such as:

- 1) A multi-year project may have had all of its budget allocated to one year
- 2) There can be delays in getting approvals, external funding, utility or Regional clearances, or in awarding tenders
- 3) Re-prioritization

To begin the transition towards multi-year budgeting, carry-overs have been assigned to the year in which the project is reasonably projected to be undertaken. For this reason 28% of the carry-overs have been allocated to 2018. In future years we anticipate more extensive use of this practice.

Major projects being carried over to 2017 include:

- Road pavement, rehabilitation, and reconstruction projects \$7,170,624;
- Water meter replacement program \$6,589,213;
- Roywood area water main rehabilitation -\$1,500,000;
- Water & wastewater servicing study implementation- \$1,000,000
- Tom Taylor Trail Davis Drive underpass \$817,658;
- Tom Taylor Trail Tannery link connections- \$587,593;
- Community Centre Lands project \$593,275;
- Community splash pad \$1,500,000;
- Artificial turf sports: field -\$1,000,000;
- Fire truck replacement \$495,731.

Major projects being carried over to 2018 include:

- Millard Road reconstruction \$2,400,000;
- Property acquisition along Holland River \$3,063,255;
- Fire Station 4-5 design and construction -\$3,687,761;
- Fire Station 4-1 renovation -\$710,000;
- Replace fire truck 97-02 -\$800,000.

The Strategic Leadership Team (SLT) has done a preliminary review of the carry-over requests and will be doing a more detailed review later this year. There will be a report to Council with further adjustments to the carry-over amount. These adjustments will be reflected in the 2017 results and carry-overs. The report will also include recommendations on procedural changes.
