INTENTION TO CHANGE BUILDING SERVICES FEES AND CHARGES

REMINDER: WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS BEGAN ON NOVEMBER 1

In addition to the existing parking regulations, from **November 1 to April 15, 2023**, vehicles cannot be parked on the road between the hours of 2 to 6 a.m. as this interferes with snow clearing operations.

FOLLOW THE SIGNALS OF THE CROSSING GUARD

Remember to follow the direction of the crossing guard and the sound of their whistles at school crossings.

How to cross safely:

1. Stop at the crosswalk and wait for a signal and the first whistle alert from the crossing guard.
2. Wait for the crossing guard to make their way to the middle of the intersection. Once it is safe to cross, the guard will sound the second whistle alert.
3. Residents and school children can now make their way across the intersection.
4. Once everyone has crossed safely, the crossing guard will sound their third and final whistle alert to signify the way is clear.

TREE PRUNING FOR THE UPCOMING WINTER SEASON

Over the next few weeks, you will see crews conducting block pruning work for approximately 1,900 Town-owned trees, and sidewalk snow plowing machines conducting dry runs in your neighbourhood to identify Town-owned and private trees, encroachments and any obstructions that may impact sidewalk snow plowing operations. Tree pruning work includes branch removal to ensure it is not interfering with sightlines and clearances on sidewalks, roadways and driveways.

PROTECT YOUR PROPERTY THIS WINTER: EDGE YOUR SOD

Help us out this winter by edging your sod and ensuring landscape features are at least 18" (45 cm) away from both sides of the sidewalk to prevent damage during winter maintenance measures. Sod that is edged will prevent tearing when sidewalk snow plows make their way through your neighbourhood.
