## PUBLIC NOTICES

### DO NOT FEED GEESE OR DUCKS

Remember to admire wildlife from afar. Don't feed bread to geese or ducks - doing so may have a long term impact. Feeding bread to geese or ducks at the lake may sound harmless, but this may cause defects such as Angel Wing - a condition that can leave geese unable to fly and migrate south for the winter.

### YARD WASTE TIP: DO NOT SWEEP LEAVES ONTO THE ROAD

Fall is just around the corner. If you are cleaning up your property, please do not sweep leaves onto the road. Doing so can clog up sewer drains which can lead to unwanted flooding. Please place all yard waste into the appropriate containers/bags for pick-up on your scheduled collection day.

### TEMPORARY TRAIL CLOSURE: WALPOLE CRESCENT TO THE FIREFLY MARSH
